
Didn't order a yearbook last year? You can purchase one from the school office for \$16. But act fast- only a few remain!

## Student Cell Phones and Apple/Smart Watches

If your student's cell phone is not essential for your after school communication, we respectfully request that cell phones be left at home whenever possible. Cell phones that come to school will be required to be powered down and stored for the day. Rules regarding student cell phone use while at school state that students must have adult "permission and supervision" to use their cell phones while at school during or after the school day (after school care, sports, etc.). Students who choose to access their phones without permission and supervision will lose the privilege of bringing their cell phones to school. Please note that we will be applying the same logic to Apple watches or other devices that can be used to send or receive calls, texts, etc. during the school day.





It's our Parish and School's largest fundraiser. We are always looking for new ideas, support, and fun people to work with! Please join us to find out how you can help make this fundraiser a success!



# Girl Scouts and Faith

Although Girl Scouts is a secular organization, we encourage girls to celebrate the powerful ties between Girl Scouts and faith. At the heart of Girl Scouting are many of the same values most faiths hold: supporting girls, making our world a better place, and building compassionate leaders.



## Girls can incorporate faith into their Girl Scouting experience in different ways, including:

**My Promise, My Faith Pin:** The My Promise, My Faith pin invites girls to experience a faith journey through exploration of the Girl Scout Law and teachings from their faith. Girl Scouts of all grade levels can earn this pin each year.

**Religious Recognition Programs:** Created by national religious organizations and approved by Girl Scouts, religious recognition programs encourage spiritual growth, reinforce Girl Scout values, and help girls grow stronger in their faith. Each religious organization develops and administers its own program.

**Girl Scouts Celebrate Faith:** Each year, the week of March 12 marks Girl Scouts Celebrate Faith Week. This is a time to recognize girls in their place of worship as Girl Scouts and thank volunteers and faith partners for their support. Activities can include participation in a worship service, planning an activity before or after the worship service, or hosting a service project.
